



Access to Education for Pregnant and Parenting Students How to File a Complaint under Title IX

If you believe you or someone you know has had his or her federal Title IX rights violated, you may file a complaint with the following agencies. These agencies also serve as a resource for questions about policies for pregnant and parenting students.

In your correspondence, please include:
 - The complainant's name, address and, if possible (although not required), a telephone number where the complainant may be reached during business hours;
 - Information about the person(s) or class of persons injured by the alleged discriminatory act(s) (names of the injured person(s) are not required);
 - The name and location of the institution that committed the alleged discriminatory act(s); and
 - A description of the alleged discriminatory act(s) in sufficient detail to enable OCR to understand what occurred, when it occurred, and the basis for the alleged discrimination (race, color, national origin, sex, disability, age or the Boy Scouts of America Equal Access Act).
 - ✓ **E-mail:** Complainants may file a complaint, using the following e-mail address: ocr@ed.gov. (Use the same procedures as above.)

Minnesota Human Rights Act

363A.13 Minnesota State Statutes

It is an unfair discriminatory practice to discriminate in any manner in the full utilization of or benefit from any educational institution, or the services rendered thereby to any person because of race, color, creed, religion, national origin, sex, age, marital status, status with regard to public assistance, sexual orientation, or disability, or to fail to ensure physical and program access for disabled persons.
