Summary of Panel Review

Project SNAPP: Skills and Knowledge for AIDS and Pregnancy Prevention (1996)

Curriculum (100 pp.) and Video (13 minutes)

For grades 5-9

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The Minnesota Sexuality Education Resource Review Panel **Recommends the use of this curriculum and video for the following reasons and with the following reservations:**

The curriculum provides good skill-building and interactive ideas, with clear directions for teachers, and suggestions for group discussion. **The video** portrays several different scenarios with teens.

The panel expressed concerns about the video due to the contrived nature of the role plays, lack of cultural diversity and sexual orientation among actors (all heterosexual, able-bodied Latino/as), questions after role plays that would not precipitate discussion, and incomplete information about HIV transmission. The panel would recommend using the curriculum and video for 6th through 9th grade, depending on the maturity level of the students, and considering the previously mentioned concerns.
