 the use of this curriculum for the following reasons and with the following reservations:

Review Summary:

Puberty: The Wonder Years is a puberty education curriculum designed to be part of a comprehensive health education program. It is targeted to late elementary and early middle school students. It is divided into three sequential sections to be taught over the course of three years, each containing six lessons. This curriculum was developed for implementation in Michigan so requires some adaptations for use in Minnesota.

The curriculum focuses on puberty - on normative adolescent sexual development, both physical and emotional, and on relationships with friends and family. The panel felt that the curriculum provides accurate information on puberty and adolescent development and provides a clear message regarding postponing sexual involvement. The panel expressed concern, however, that the curriculum does not address STD/HIV prevention or the use of condoms/contraception. They recommended that the leader supplement the curriculum with videos and other activities that focus on these areas.

The panel felt the curriculum lacks activities that address social pressures and needs more opportunities to practice communication, negotiation, and refusal skills.

The panel found the curriculum to be teacher-friendly with clear directions and handouts for each lesson. They felt, however, that the activities would require extra prep time and a leader with moderate content knowledge and group leading skills. Panel members noted that the curriculum relies on supplemental materials, videos and brochures that are not included. Panel members felt that supplemental materials, however, could be drawn from other MSERRP approved materials.

Overall, the panel **recommends** the use of *Puberty: The Wonder Years* as a part of a comprehensive sexuality education program.
