Review Summary:

Unequal Partners: Teaching about Power and Consent in Adult-Teen and Other Relationships, 3rd Edition, is designed to help young people (ages 10-17) understand the characteristics of healthy relationships; learn how to avoid, change or end relationships that are unhealthy; and prevent unintended pregnancy, sexually transmitted infections and emotional, physical and sexual abuse. Although the focus of **Unequal Partners** is to confront the issue of teen female – adult male relationships, the activities found in **Unequal Partners** help students develop criteria for evaluating **any** relationship. These include teen male – adult female and same sex relationships.

The panel highly recommends *Unequal Partners* for the following reasons:

- Consent is addressed a great deal in manual.
- The language used is inclusive of multiple groups of young people, including GLBTQ youth.
- Facilitator can use pieces of manual.
- It gives participants an opportunity to assess their own relationships.

The panel has concerns about the following elements of *Unequal Partners*:

- Lack of explorations/ discussion of cultural differences in perceptions of adult – teen/child relationships.
- Manual is wordy and text heavy. Materials need to be read more than once for understanding.
- Not enough information is included on teen male – older female relationships.

Panel feels that *Unequal Partners* is an excellent, well priced resource on a much-needed topic.

Overall, the panel **highly recommends** *Unequal Partners: Teaching about Power and Consent in Adult-Teen and Other Relationships, 3rd Edition*.
