Introduction

The Minnesota Sexuality Education Resource Review Panel (MSERRP), the Federal Review Panel required by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, is designed to ensure that high quality HIV prevention and sexuality education materials are purchased and used by schools, public agencies, and community organizations throughout Minnesota.

The purpose of the Resource Reviews is to inform educators, parents and communities about reliable sexuality education and HIV prevention materials. All materials in this resource kit were evaluated based on current research on comprehensive sexuality education in schools, using a set of specific criteria developed by the panel. Each resource review includes the panel's determination of whether the resource is recommended or not recommended; a summary of the strengths and limitations of the material; and the resource's rating on each criterion. The Resource Reviews feature detailed assessments of brochures, curricula, games, manuals and videos reviewed by the Minnesota Sexuality Education Resource Review Panel between May, 1998 and January, 2002.

Reviews that are completed by the Panel after January, 2002 will be made available as additional inserts to this resource kit by Coordinated School Health.
