Implementing School-wide Social & Emotional Learning for Student and Staff Success
Roger Weissberg, President, The Collaborative for Academic, Social and Emotional Learning

CASEL's three-year effort to summarize the state of research and practitioner knowledge about sustainable school wide implementation of social and emotional learning programming is presented. Participants will learn the steps, stages and factors that make for successful SEL and how the adults in school communities benefit when they take on this work on behalf of students.



Drug Abuse and Addiction Research: From Prevention to Recovery
Donald Vereen, Deputy Director, Office of National Drug Control Policy

This session will provide an overview of addiction as a brain and developmental disease, and the multiple genetic and environmental factors involved. The brain changes associated with different drugs and the pattern of changes associated with addiction will be reviewed. A model of the addicted brain will be presented to help explain what we know about drug addiction and how present and potential treatments work.



Beginning in Infancy: Implications for Brain Development, Learning & Mental Health
Terrie Rose, Psychologist

Theory, research and case studies will be presented to demonstrate the impact of experiences beginning in infancy on the social and emotional competency, neuropsychological development, and academic success of children and youth. The influences of environmental, experiential, and relationship factors on learning and mental health will be highlighted.



Cultural Wisdom: Health and Education
Roberto Dansie, Clinical Psychologist

This presentation will provide the participants with a paradigm to understand the dynamics between culture, health and education. Participants will also learn specific techniques to build rapport across diverse cultural practices.

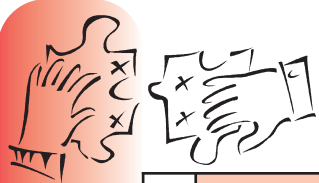
