The Minnesota Sexuality Education Resource Review Panel **Highly Recommends the use of this video for the following reasons and with the following reservations:**

“That’s A Family” is designed to help elementary school-aged children recognize and appreciate the different types of families that exist today. Children from diverse family structures share their perspectives on what makes a “family”. It is not inclusive of all family types, but does include a wide variety of family configurations. Concepts such as “birth mom,” “mixed race,” “guardian,” “gay and lesbian,” “adoption,” “step-dad,” etc. are explained directly by the children in the video. The graphics and video layout are visually appealing and engaging for young audiences.

Panel members found the video to be technically accurate; gender and culturally non-biased; and based on sound educational methodology. They felt it communicated positive messages about sexuality and healthy relationships. The panel found the video to be appropriate for the intended audience, however, recommended breaking it into short segments when using it with lower elementary grades. Although this video is designed especially for children in elementary school, the panel recommended its use for a variety of audiences including parents and other adults.

The panel found the video to be teacher friendly especially given the accompanying discussion/teaching guide that provides ideas for follow-up activities, as well as for teacher preparation prior to showing the video. The panel recommended that schools/community groups gain support/involvement from parents and school/community leaders prior to using the video. The discussion guide includes suggestions for how to involve parents/guardians, a sample letter to send home, and answers to some common questions educators or parents may ask. The panel stressed that teachers should be prepared to respond to feedback about inclusion of some controversial topics (e.g., same-sex and mixed-race families) and be familiar with resources related to these issues.
